## Chicken project

This project is one of our pioneer project that we started to enable us to be self sustainable, we started with 20 chicken, we have managed to increase the number to 40 chickens, which falls below our expected target of 200 chicken by now ,this was occasioned by outbreak of diseases leadind to death of some chicken and derailing the productivity of others, however the production of eggs has remained relatively average and we have used some of the eggs



to enrich the meals at the home. In the mean time we still aim to reach chicken population of 200 by the end of this year, we have put in place cor-rectional measure to check on the above mentioned chal-lenges.



## Posho mill & beads projects



This project has been of great help to community at large, as they have been able to grind their maize without any problem and in return helps us to get some stipend to sustain our programme. We plan to carry out marketing so as to attract institutions like schools and colleges that grind maize in large quantities so as to get

substantial returns.

-the kids are also preparing for the second phase of beads and necklaces making, we expect them to make quite anumber of beads which we hope to sell and get some money to pay teachers salaries.



## Dairy Farming



We have two freshian cows for production of milk, which is used by our students popula-tion, however due to high population of our students the milk is not enough , its our wish to acquire another to cows to supplement this.



We do grow various crops on our farm i.e kales , cabbages, beans and yams . These we use for domestic purposes as vegetables for students thus cutting costs. Slow food programme has been ablessing for us as we have been able to diversify into other crops while utilizing

## Tree nursery

We have just revived our tree nursery, we intend to plant 1000 tree seedlings by the end of may, some of these tree seedlings we shall plant on our compound and some we shall sell to enable us get some revenue to see us through our activities.
