Our vegetable garden, the green house and the nursery projects have greatly benefited from the wetness of this season. So far we've been able to partition the garden to ensure maximization of space; we intend to have water distributed to the small sized plot by piping. COW PROJECT

This is a major project to us. Our three cows and one calf produce twelve litres of milk daily which assists in the diets of the young children. Manure is made available to our vegetables, several challenges are being encountered in this project including lack of animal feeds and materials such as; gumboots, heavy duty groves dust coats etc.



CHICKEN PROJECT

It is growing and increasing fast a source of subsidize in terms of income, eggs and manure. We intend to expand and enlarge it beginning 2013.
